What is content syndication

- Offering your own content for use on other sites
- Receiving up to date information from content providers for use on your website or Intranet

Why use it

- Automatically add related content to your site at no cost
- Keeping a site fresh and up to date
- Make your information available to subscribers and other websites/ Intranets
- To drive traffic to your website increase "stickiness" a reason to come back

- General or Categorised News feeds
- Service information
- What's New
- Product special offers
- Job postings
- Subscription to your site for services
